It was the center of a semi-feudal empire based in the Mohawk Valley in Upstate NY. From his seat of power, Johnson ruled the lives and fortunes of thousands of his tenants, neighbors, and later, fellow Tories. Sharing his home and his life was his wife, Molly Brant(sister of Joseph). Her influence dominated in the running of this palatial estate, as well as a major influence in her husbands' policies. Johnson Hall, today, is open to the public.
